## THE ROYAL ALBERT MEMORIAL, KENSINGTON GARDENS, THE ROYAL PARKS



Commissioned by Queen Victoria in 1861 in memory of her husband King Albert, the Grade II listed Royal Albert Memorial was designed by George Gilbert Scott and sculpted by John Bell.

The highly ostentatious, high-Victorian gothic statue presides over Kensington Gardens, facing the Royal Albert Hall another architectural tribute to the royal consort. At high level, Triton commenced the works which included cleaning, repointing and replacements of the marble elements including the friezes, marble statuary to Industrial arts

and the continents and pedestal bases which stand at each corner of the memorial.

Further works included the repairs



and replacement of missing carved elements and incidents, cleaning patination and re-waxing of the bronze work. Minor repairs to gilding of the prince consort were included in the list of works completed by skilled workers. Cleaning and repointing of granite columns and bases, sandstone capitals and paving.

As a testament to a royal who died young and was much loved by his subjects, the newly-restored Albert Memorial was completed in June 2013 and re-opened to public.
