## Moncler

43-44 New Bond Street, London W1

First built in the 1720's and included within the Mayfair Conservation Area, 43-44 New Bond Street encompasses the opulence of the luxury shopping district, with its classic façade, attached columns and decorative arches. Now modernised to house contemporary designer Moncler, the building boasts multiple levels of a high end retail experience.

Triton Restoration were commissioned to complete restoration works on the façade of the building. This required intricate inspection to survey to extent of the damage, mechanical aids such as the Mobile Elevating Work platform (MEWP, pictured) and the use of our masonry expertise to restore the aesthetic impact of the building.



Being within the Mayfair Conservation Area, it was imperative that all works that took place were not only sympathetic to the buildings history, but also on a tight deadline to



limit disruption to the street's high footfall .

Once the damaged areas had been identified, our works included repair to structural damage, repointing, and providing plastic repairs.

Part of the works included completing a full clean which required multiple approaches such as jet washing, steam cleaning and a use of our thermatech machine.

Additionally, reglazing a fourth floor Georgian wire window. With careful attention, using the MEWP we were all able to address this repair to programme and to cost.

Working on a high-profile site posed challenges, including securing pavement protection and a crane license from the Local Authority.

Triton ensured full Health and Safety compliance, obtaining all necessary approvals within the project deadline.

The restoration of 43-44 New Bond Street reflects Triton Restoration's dedication to preserving London's architectural heritage while accommodating the demands of a vibrant modern retail environment. By combining specialist masonry skills, careful planning, and considerate methods of access, Triton delivered sensitive façade repairs that honoured the building's historic significance and met the logistical challenges of a bustling commercial setting.
